Kathy Roth-Douquet is an award-winning author, attorney, military family advocate, commentator, and a former Clinton White House and Pentagon appointee. She currently serves as senior legal advisor to the Center for Naval Analysis, a think-tank in Washington, DC, and on the panel for the Court of Appeals in California. Kathy has worked in every presidential campaign of the past 25 years, most recently as an advisor to the Obama campaign and transition. She is a senior Fellow for the Truman National Security Project, and a Fellow with the Inter-University Seminar on Armed Forces in Society. She is the co-author, with Frank Schaeffer, of two books: *AWOL, The Unexcused Absence of America's Upper Classes from Military Service and How It Hurts the Country* (Collins, 2006) and *How Free People Move Mountains* (Collins, 2008). Kathy has appeared on the Today Show, Fox and Friends, NPR, PBS and other television; her commentary has appeared frequently in USA Today, as well as other major newspapers and magazines.

Kathy Roth-Douquet received her B.A. from Bryn Mawr College, her MPA in International Affairs from the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University where she held a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship, and a JD from the University of San Diego School of Law, Magna Cum Laude and the Order of the Coif. While serving at the Pentagon as Principal Assistant Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (Acting) she received the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service for her work on defense reform. Kathy Roth-Douquet is founder of *Blue Stars Families*. She serves on the advisory board of the wounded warrior charity, *Hope For the Warriors* and the veterans charity *Beyond Tribute*. Kathy lives on Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island, with her husband, an active duty Marine officer, and their two school age children.
